WEEKENDER TEAM – January 16-19, 2015

This is now the third year (in January) that we have enjoyed having with us twelve students from Messiah College in Pennsylvania. They're here in Loreto taking a three-week course on International Development, led by their professor Dr. Connie Ostwald. They all lived at our home/ministry center - sleeping on our patio (in sleeping bags on cots); and cooking many of their own meals - using our outdoor kitchen. 'Chayito' came to our home a couple of days, teaching them how to cook Mexican food, and a few times we went to some of the local restaurants.

After devotions each morning, Connie conducted her classes (on our patio) and our role was to confirm her teaching using examples from the local people, and sharing how we minister effectively here in Baja Sur, Mexico. Each afternoon and evening, they had various activities to be involved in, in and around Loreto - to help them obtain a greater appreciation for another area of the world, a different people/language/culture, etc. and to interact in some way with each. They've enjoyed talking with the locals on the streets, in their shops, and interacting/participating with people in three different local evangelical churches.

Also 'Rafa' took them hiking in the mountains; and because he has his own dive shop - he and his workers took them out in their boats to snorkel, to visit one of the uninhabited islands close by and to go fishing.

Don drove them all many times (in the 15 passenger van we were given a few years ago), to various places in Loreto during their time here, and one day we drove them all to San Javier - an historic town in the nearby mountains. And through this and all of the other things they did, they gained a great understanding of what is involved in living cross-culturally in another country.

To help them understand how to help people in

practical ways, in another part of the world, they were involved in our January Health Fairs, which this month were in Loreto.

So this class is not just to teach an introductory course on International Development, but also to give the students some first hand experience for what they're being taught in their course - making this a practical experience for them all and therefore their time with us has helped them build the foundation for the rest of their lives. What a joy it's been to have had this opportunity to have input into these student's lives, knowing they'll use these three weeks to formulate what they'll do the rest of their lives.


