It has been quite a year for us. When we sent out our letter one year ago Kristi was starting her six rounds of chemotherapy. We were looking at needing to raise 100% of Craig's financial support through donations. Craig's arm was in the slow healing process. Then, early in January, Kristi sensed a still small voice say, "I will supply all you need." As we look back over this past year we are excited to testify to you of God's providence in our lives.

Physically: Craig had a surgery removing the hardware from his wrist and fixing carpal tunnel at the same time. This has helped to alleviate almost all of the pain he was having and his strength has returned to about 90% of what it was. Kristi made it through chemo without one episode of vomiting! Of the myriad of side effects that she could/ should have had, hair loss, tiredness and some numbness in fingers and toes were the only significant ones. After three treatments her PET scan came back clear! She finished all six rounds of chemo as was recommended. Her last treatment was February 13. She continues to check in with her oncologist every 3 months. Each of her oncology visits

brings a good report. She plan to have another scan in May 2015. We are trusting God for complete healing and another "clear" scan. God is our Healer.

When we were with a team in Palengue in September, the van Craig and the kids were in with some team members was hit broadside at about 45 mph by a large transit van. While this could have been bad in so many ways, we can only see organizations. God is our the things to be grateful for: Provider. it happened right in front of our hospital where our Mexican friends could help us, there were no serious injuries, the pedestrians (a patient) who had been standing in that spot a minute before had just left in a taxi, we had full insurance coverage, we had time to work through the insurance process without missing flights. While we counted up the amounts that people had pledged to send in, it never seemed to add up to what was needed, but then without fail, as it was needed, a one time gift or a yearly gift would come in so that we had what was needed.
