Since our last update I, Dave, have continued to see doctors and they keep telling us not to worry they will get me fixed up like new. On February 23, they performed a Heart Ablation in which they burn specific nerve ending to prevent the wayward nerves from causing my irregular heart rate. So far it appears to be a success but will need to wait 2-3 months to know the long term success.

The past 6 months have forced us to spend most of the time in Oregon for doctor visits, lab tests, and medical procedures. This was not what we planned. However, as I have said many times to people and groups, God wants us to "bloom where we are planted", and we have. It has been very interesting when medical people learn that we work with a medical mission. Just last week I had a very interesting conversation with my nurse who said her father was a pastor nearby and how could she use her training to serve God. We had a great conversation for about 30 minutes as she was hooking me up to equipment and go through tests all the while training a student nurse. What a great opportunity to talk about the what and why of what we do in Mexico. The student seemed interested but had very little to say. If the latest procedure is successful we hope to be back in Mexico full time before summer.

Paul Goodner and Charles Ulibarri, who are both missionaries with Action International Ministries, travel the world training Christian leaders how to be more effective as leaders.



Another Bible school contacted us and after sharing for over an hour with their students they are interested in us presenting the entire training in the future.

God has provided these opportunities and we continue to partner with other ministries when it is a benefit to God's work
