This group of believers is certainly exhibiting that life in many ways, including having a heart for reaching people with the good news about Jesus. They have done many outreach projects, here in Tecate, including medical outreaches throughout the community.

In the last couple of years, Pan de Vida has taken short term mission trips to San Quintin, Baja, Mexico (community about 5 hours south of Tecate). These endeavors have sparked a desire to do more.

For the last several months before departure, they had been preparing a team from the church for a mission trip to Guinea-Bissau, Africa (May 6-24). They had fund raising activities, orientation and training meetings to prepare the team and they asked me (Vince) to help with a cross-cultural training in April. This was a first for me on the mission field... training a team from Mexico for cross-cultural ministry.

One of the Sundays while the team was in Africa, the Pan de Vida Church asked me to preach. It was a first for me to preach a mission challenge here in Mexico. It is usually a message I would preach in our American churches. It is such a blessing to be a part of a church here in Mexico as they seek to fulfill the great commission.

## Hemet Valley Baptist Church Comes to Serve with Iglesia de La Hermosa!



The Hemet Valley Baptist Church from Hemet, CA came this July. Their 25 team members came to help for a week at the seminary (STBC) as well as work with Iglesia de La Hermosa, next to the seminary in Tecate. This photo includes both churches, Hemet Valley and La Hermosa.

The team worked hard on construction and maintenance work, including painting, demolition, ground leveling, pouring concrete, and laying brick for a patio area outside of the seminary kitchen. It was hard work in the hot sun and many of the team had never done this kind of work. Some of the ladies did a sewing class while sewing curtains for the seminary

classrooms. They left two machines with La Hermosa Baptist Church for them to use as needed.

The team also spent time helping La Hermosa reach out to the community around the church. Special services were planned, visits were made where testimonies were shared, and people were invited to come to the church for a special service each evening. One result from the visits was that *a family of six prayed to receive Christ*.
