You go back like a farmer heading home after a long day of planting, perhaps tired, but filled with hope because of the seed you sowed. Thank you.

During my time in Tijuana, I made preparations for the Bible school graduation that's coming up on July 18th. Pricing plaques, caps and gowns, and making the other necessary arrangements is a lot of work, but the students are very excited, and so am I. It will be very exciting to see how God will use each of these graduates that are preparing to go illuminate this world with the light of the talents and ministries that God is giving each one of them. Some are nervous, others feel a little uncertain yet are excited to go out and serve the Kingdom of God.

In the last newsletter, I mentioned two of our students that had to travel back to their villages in the state of Guerrero to apply for identification documents needed to register as ministers in accordance with the laws here. They have since returned and I would like to share with you how each is doing. Gerardo was able to meet with his family, obtained all the required documents and came back on Wednesday, June 9th.

Celso, who left home at a young age 12 years ago, was able to reunite with his family. Sadly, he learned that during his time away, his father had passed away. His mother is doing well and was very happy to see her son again. She is also supportive of his new faith, because she sees the changes in Celso's life. His brothers helped him get his paperwork sorted out and now he has all the needed documents. While there he saw a great spiritual need in his village, a village with a long history of idolatry. His family told him it will be very difficult to start a church but God has laid a strategy out in his heart, "It will take time, but I will



work with the community, winning them over one by one until there are enough of us to raise up a church in the

village." After his graduation he plans on being here at La Esperanza for a little while, then will return to his village to stay and start what the Lord has placed on his heart, first with his family, then his community.

We are continuing to hold services in homes and God keeps using this as a way of winning souls for His Kingdom. Some of those who have been reached recently will be getting baptized on June 20th and others will be entering the Bible school so they can be prepared to serve the Kingdom of God.

We had the opportunity to minister at a youth gathering for many local churches. I had the privilege of sharing a message which challenged the youth to give their lives for the cause of the Gospel, to be aware of the times, and to recognize that the final harvest is approaching. The IBMC students presented a very powerful drama about the need to understand that many of our friends are perishing and facing an eternity in a place of torment, away from God.



Women's Conference

More than 400 women attended a women's conference hosted at our church. A week later we also shared with about 260 men, whom we challenged to be lights in their homes and workplaces, and to carry out the role that God has given them.
