San Vicente Mission's Trip

Lynne and I are thrilled to hear about the missions trip the church in San Vicente took the first two weeks of January. The past 3 years they have planned, raised the funds and made the trip without any outside funds or assistance. Praise God for their desire to serve God and others.

While in Nayarit they returned to a town they visited last year in which a few hours after arriving the local police chief, Priest, and many of the towns people ran them out of town by throwing rocks and beating on their vans. When they talked about the incident that evening pastor told me last year the Angels said they wanted to return because those people need Jesus.

When they arrived this year the mayor and many of the towns people welcomed them and a family offered a large house for them to have a place to stay. A very prominent lady who owned a beach resort told them she would provide all their meals (8 meals for 30 people) while they were in town. The group was pleased but shocked at the change in the community.

The past 6 years the church has been going to Isla (island) de Mexcaltitan . The first time we went we were told by the community leaders that a Bible study had started but they did not want that on the island and had run the 3 families off the island. After the third visit, and having children's outreaches in the town square, we were told by the mayor that when ever we came, the island was different after we left. Because of the change in people we were welcome any time and if we let them know all community activities would be cancelled. Last year a small Bible study had started and they asked the San Vicente church if they could provide a pastor.

Oscar is a young man whom has taken all the Bible classes we have provided the past five years, and has been mentored by Pastor Jose, and the plan was for him to stay on the island to lead this new "church". When the San Vicente group arrived they learned that a local pastor had stepped up and had been coming out to the island every week for a few months. Not wanting to disrupt, Oscar wisely chose to return to Baja with the team. Lynne and I are so excited to watch the church train and send out their own people. By June we expect 4 of the Angels to be in full time ministry and several others are in school with plans to enter full time ministry. Eight of the nine leading worship Sunday were Angels. It is so good to see how God is using this church to change lives
