Later at a small museum, we were talking with the curator about our experience giving a Bible away at the military outpost up the road. She heard the word "Bible", and said there is a missionary couple you should meet, and called them to see if they were home. We ended up spending the evening with them and later learned their church in San Ignacio has a special connection with our fellow missionaries in Nueva Odisea.



Being receptive, flexible, and willing to listen are valuable things we've learned on our journey, as well as humbly remembering we don't have all the answers. There are many little stories we could recount from our month of travels and we are sure to have many more adventures ahead of us.

We plan to serve in Cabo San Lucas in March and then head to Guanajuato in April for two months. We also look forward to sharing more about our most recent medical outreach at the beginning of February to La Purisima. There is much to tell!
